Les Miserables Story

Les Misérables has been translated into 22 different languages:

English, Japanese, Hebrew, Hungarian, Icelandic, Norwegian, German, Polish, Swedish, Dutch, Danish, French, Czech, Castilian, Mauritian Creole, Flemish, Finnish, Argentinean, Portuguese, Estonian, Mexican Spanish and Korean.

Productions have played in 42 countries and over 319 cities:

England, United States of America, Japan, Israel, Hungary, Australia, Iceland, Norway, Austria, Canada, Poland, Sweden, Holland, Denmark, New Zealand, France, The Czech Republic, Spain, Northern Ireland, Eire, Scotland, Wales, Bermuda, Malta, Philippines, Mauritius, Singapore, Germany, Hong Kong, Korea, South Africa, Belgium, Finland, Argentina, Brazil, Estonia, China, Mexico, Switzerland, Serbia, The Channel Islands, The Dominican Republic & Kuwait.

The production has played over 48,000 professional performances giving a total audience figure of more than 60 million people worldwide. 125,000 people attended the 1989 Australia Day concert in Sydney, which has been the

biggest single live audience for Les Misérables to date. 400 million viewers in 197 countries created the biggest broadcast audience for Les Misérables when the 1996 European Football Championship starring 250 cast members was televised.

The London production of *Les Misérables* is the world's longest running musical where it played 7,602 performances at the Palace Theatre before transferring to the Queen's Theatre where it opened on 3th April 2004. It celebrated the 10,000th performance on 2 January 2010. There are approximately 101 cast and crew directly involved in every performance, not including front of house staff, ticket sales, wardrobe staff, set contractors, maintenance, office staff, advertising and publicity. Each performance entails some 392 costumes consisting of over 5000 items of clothing and 85 wigs.

The Barricades move 19.5 meters per show at the Queen's Theatre. Les Misérables has won over 100 major theatre awards including an Olivier, Tony & Grammy. There have been over 47 cast recordings of Les Misérables including albums, singles and the symphonic. Both the original Broadway cast album and the symphonic recordings won Grammy awards.



The Les Misérables Schools' Edition was launched in the USA on 10th May 2001 at Holy Trinity High School, Hicksville, New York and in the UK on 14th October 2002 at Stanwell School, Cardiff. Since then there have been over 3,000 schools' productions performed by over 150,000 school children in the UK, US and Australia making it the most successful musical ever produced in schools.

Les Misérables celebrated the 10th Anniversary of its world premiere on 8th October 1995 with a gala concert at the Royal Albert Hall, London. The concert starred the original 'Jean Valjean', Colm Wilkinson, who led a company of 250 artists and 100 musicians. The specifically arranged finale featured 17 different Jean Valjean's from around the world singing in many of the languages in which the show has been performed.

The 10th Anniversary Concert was filmed for television and has since been seen by over 4 million viewers in the UK. The video has gone on to sell over 1.7 million copies worldwide. A special double disc collector's edition DVD was released in the UK in November 2005. On 18th November 2004 a special concert performance was given at Windsor Castle in honor of the President of the French Republic and Jacques Chirac to celebrate the centenary of the Entente Cordiale.

To celebrate its 21st Birthday a special 90-minute version of the show was recorded with the BBC Concert Orchestra and broadcast on BBC Radio 2.

Director Douglas Kamo



With 20 years in the performance and entertainment industry Dunedin-based Douglas is one of the busiest producers and entertainers in this part of the country having amassed an impressive array of drama, television, concert and musical theatre credits.

As a producer and director he has been responsible for over 50 national and international musical theatre productions including *The Rocky Horror Show, Les Misérables, The Producers, Buddy - The Buddy Holly Story, Jesus Christ Superstar, Hot Shoe Shuffle, Cabaret, Chess, Me & My Girl, 42nd Street and A Chorus Line.* He toured New Zealand & Asia in the international casts of *Chicago* and *Joseph & the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat.*

Television credits include regular guest appearances on Xena Warrior Princess, Street Legal, Shortland Street,
The Pretender and Passion in Paradise. As a television host he fronted the high profile weekly draw of Lotto for 2 ½
years as well as The Lounge, 3 seasons of Destination New Zealand and the award winning reality game show The Vodafone V24 Challenge. He currently has his own show playing on the Living Channel called Hit the Road.

He was Producer & Artistic Director of the community opening of the Forsyth Barr Stadium in Dunedin Otago Daily Times - Big Night In which drew an estimated audience of 22,000 and one of the founders of the Queenstown Shotover Jet Remarkable Christmas - Stadium Spectacular.

With an envious reputation within the lower South Island as a market leader for corporate entertainment solutions, tours, concerts and theatrical experiences, his company DKCM Ltd now provides entertainment and event & production solutions for upwards of 30 corporate and special events nationally each year.

Les Misérables is an emotionally moving tale of revolution, obsession, loyalty, friendship and love. It begins in 1815 and ends ten years later at a time of hope and reconciliation.

ACT 1

PROLOGUE: 1815, TOULON

Jean Valjean, released on parole after 19 years on the chain gang, finds that the yellow ticket-of-leave he must, by law, display condemns him to be an outcast. Only the saintly Bishop of Digne treats him kindly and Valjean, embittered by years of hardship, repays him by stealing some silver. Valjean is caught and brought back by police, and is astonished when the Bishop lies to the police to save him, also giving him two precious candlesticks. Valjean decides to start his life anew.

1823, MONTREUIL-SUR-MER

Eight years have passed and Valjean, having broken his parole and changed his name to Monsieur Madeleine, has risen to become both a factory owner and Mayor. One of his workers, Fantine, has a secret illegitimate child. When the other women discover this, they demand her dismissal. The foreman, whose advances she has rejected, throws her out. Desperate for money to pay for medicines for her daughter, Fantine sells her locket, her hair, and then joins the whores in selling herself. Utterly degraded by her new trade, she gets into a fight with a prospective customer and is about to be taken to prison by Javert when "The Mayor" arrives and demands she be taken to a hospital instead. The Mayor then rescues a man pinned down by a runaway cart. Javert is reminded of the abnormal strength of convict 24601 Jean Valjean, a parole-breaker whom he has been tracking for years, but who, he says, has just been recaptured. Valjean, unable to see an innocent man go to prison in his place, confesses to the court that he is prisoner 24601. At the hospital, Valjean promises the dying Fantine to find and look after her daughter Cosette. Javert arrives to arrest him, but Valjean escapes.

1823, MONTFERMEIL

Little Cosette has been lodged for five years with the Thénardiers who run an inn, horribly abusing the little girl whom they use as a skivvy while indulging their own daughter, Éponine. Valjean finds Cosette fetching water in the dark. He pays the Thénardiers to let him take Cosette away and takes her to Paris. But Javert is still on his tail ...

PARIS. 1833

Ten years later there is a great unrest in the city because of the likely demise of the popular leader General Lamarque, the only man left in the Government who shows any feeling for the poor. The urchin Gavroche is in his element mixing with the whores and beggars of the capital. Among the street gangs is one led by Thénardier and his wife, which sets upon Jean Valjean and Cosette. They are rescued by Javert, who does not recognize Valjean until after he has made good his escape.

The Thénardiers' daughter Éponine, who is secretly in love with the student Marius, reluctantly agrees to help him find Cosette, with whom he has fallen in love. At a political meeting in a small cafe, a group of idealistic students prepare for the revolution they are sure will erupt on the death of General Lamarque. When Gavroche brings the news of the General's death, the students, led by Enjoiras, stream out into the streets to whip up popular support. Only Marius is distracted by thoughts of the mysterious Cosette.

Cosette is consumed by thoughts of Marius, with whom she has fallen in love. Valjean realizes that his "daughter" is changing very quickly but refuses to tell her anything of her past. In spite of her own feelings for Marius, Eponine sadly brings him to Cosette and then prevents an attempt by her father's gang to rob Valjean's house. Valjean, convinced it was Javert who was lurking outside his house, tells Cosette they must prepare to flee the country. On the eve of the revolution the students and Javert see the situation from their different viewpoints; Cosette and Marius part in despair of ever meeting again; Éponine mourns the loss of Marius; and Valjean looks forward to the security of exile. The Thénardiers, meanwhile, dream of rich pickings underground from the chaos to come.

ACT 2

PARIS

The students prepare to build the barricade. Marius, noticing that Éponine has joined the insurrection, sends her with a letter to Cosette, which is intercepted at the Rue Plumet by Valjean. Éponine decides, despite what he has said to her, to rejoin Marius at the barricade.

THE BARRICADES

The barricade is built and the revolutionaries defy an army warning that they must give up or die. Gavroche exposes Javert as a police spy. In trying to return to the barricade Éponine is shot and killed. Valjean arrives at the barricades in search of Marius. He is given the chance to kill Javert, but instead lets him go.

THE BATTLE

The students settle down for a night on the barricade and, in the quiet of the night, Valjean prays to God to save Marius from the onslaught which is to come. The next day, with ammunition running low, Gavroche runs out to collect more and is shot. The rebels are all killed, including their leader, Enjolras. Valjean escapes into the sewers with the unconscious Marius. After meeting Thénardier, who is robbing the corpses of the rebels, he emerges into the light only to meet Javert once more. He pleads for time to deliver the young man to a hospital. Javert decides to let him go and, his unbending principles of justice having been shattered by Valjean's own mercy, he kills himself by throwing himself into the swollen River Seine. A number of Parisian women come to terms with the failed insurrection and its victims. Unaware of the identity of his rescuer, Marius recovers in Cosette's care.

THE WEDDING

Valjean confessed the truth of his past to Marius and insists that after the young couple are married, he must go away rather than taint the sanctity and safety of their union. At Marius and Cosette's wedding the Thénardiers try to blackmail Marius. Thénardier produces a ring which he stole from the corpse in the sewers the night the barricades fell. It is Marius' own ring, and he realises it was Valjean who rescued him that night.

DEATH

Marius and Cosette go to Valjean, where Cosette learns for the first time of her own history before Valjean dies, joining the spirits of Fantine, Éponine and all those who died on the barricades.



Jean Valjean - Peter Storer

Peter is thrilled to be playing the role of Jean Valjean. When Musical Theatre Dunedin (MTD) produced Les Misérables in 2001, he enjoyed portraying the evil Thénardier. Peter's most recent work with the Taieri Musical Society (TMS) has been as Professor Henry Higgins in their 2011 production of My Fair Lady. He has also played Daddy Warbucks - Annie, Anatoly - Chess, and Rev. Moore - Footloose for TMS. Peter's first major role was 25 years ago as Tevye in the OBHS/OGHS production of Fiddler on the Roof, a role he reprised in 2003 (MTD). In 2009 he played the unscrupulous and moneyhungry Max Bialystock in The Producers (MTD), a shameless and hilarious piece of musical theatre which was also directed by Douglas Kamo.

He has learned singing from Gladys Hope over the years and is particularly grateful for her guidance with his breathing and shaping of notes.

Peter is a teacher at Silverstream (South) Primary where he loves to pass on his passion for music and drama. Peter has loved working again with Douglas and Bridget who are enthusiastic coaches, demanding mentors, and talented performers themselves. He has enjoyed working with all of the team, cast and crew, who have worked so hard for so long to bring this brilliant musical to life.




II Javert - John Kiernan-Sear





























Enjolras Kelvin Cummings


Evan Fenemor


Jenniser Hughson


Peter Whigham

















Department Managers


Programme & Marketing Manager - Clint Gaby


